business studies. For the first two years, the students are mixed in with a group of students from other business degrees, like Human Resources and International Business and E-Business."

Students will then spend years 3 and 4 specializing in tourism.

Tourism Management Prof. Mary Lendway says, "It's a unique program in that there are no other university programs or college

programs that are structured the same way so that there is a business focus and then a specialization.

"Ideally, we want the students to transition into the tourism industry or hospitality industry, but with the transferable skills that they gain and the knowledge that they learned within the first two years of the business foundation, they can move into other areas as well," Lendway adds.

Haleigh DiBattista is enrolled in the Tourism Management program. "When I was researching this four years ago, the thing that drew me to this program was that I was not only getting the tourism experience, but I was getting a business experience and then, mixed with that, you've got the co-op."
