

# SEE THE WORLD WITH ROBERTSON

Professional travel counsellors spend their days planning trips for clients, and the knowledge of international locations and how the travel industry works is essential.

Robertson graduates can expect to qualify for employment in positions such as travel counsellor, travel agent and travel consultant. Students have found employment working for small and large travel agencies, tour operators and airlines. "Overall our travel counsellor program has done extremely well in its placement rates," says Fuchs.

venient, when you start getting into complicated trips, Fuchs recommends that it's always wiser to have someone to help you sort it out. And for that reason, he sees an ongoing demand for Robertson graduates. "They need someone who can look after them even when they're away. If something goes wrong, you have a point person to go to."

Robertson College provides the use of a laptop computer throughout the program, which you can purchase at the end of your program for a reduced price. And students participate in a one-week instructional Familiarization (FAM) Trip. Past classes have visited Cuba, Jamaica, Mexico, and various U.S. destinations.
