If you are interested in a career in law enforcement, Humber's Criminal Justice Program can give you the education you need in an exciting and diverse field that offers a variety of challenging career avenues and opportunities. The program will provide you with a broad-based understanding of the criminal justice system.

This professional degree program begins in September at Humber's Lakeshore campus. Toward the end of the eight semesters, you will have the op-

portunity to sharpen new skills while gaining crucial on-the-job work experience during two mandatory eight-week work terms.

KEY CONCEPTS

You will start with introductory courses that provide a fundamental understanding of key concepts such as crime, victimization, criminalization, criminal justice and penal practice.

Later in the program, course content includes more in-depth study of the nature and causes of crime; processes for managing crime, victimization; community safety; rehabilitation; and alternatives to incarceration.
